and plans were reported to the local extension office in advance of the	
effort being implemented and advertised, for pre-approval that it follows	
Kansas 4-H, KSRE, and Post Rock District policy and expectations.	
<b>3-X.</b> The club was actively represented on county-level committees	
overseen by the 4-H Council.	
<b>3-Y.</b> The club engaged in a 48 Hours of 4-H service project. This includes	
pre-registering the project with Kansas 4-H and completing the reporting	
expectations with the state.	
<b>3-Z.</b> Club members participated at a Post Rock District 4-H Day in a club	
or group category.	
<b>3-AA.</b> The club enjoyed a family fun event (picnic, swim party, movie,	
bowling, etc.).	
<b>3-BB.</b> The club engaged in fundraisers planned and facilitated by the 4-H	
Council, including but not limited to the fair food stand, prize donations,

<b>3-00.</b> A club member applied to represent the Post Rock District on the	
Kansas Youth Leadership Council.	
<b>3-PP.</b> A club member applied for a 4-H Senior/Continuing Education	
Scholarship at the local, county, district, or state level.	
<b>3-QQ.</b> The club provided a scholarship opportunity to assist members	
with the financial expenses associated with attending 4-H educational	
events, camps and conferences.	
<b>3-RR.</b> The club contributed to a charity not affiliated with the mission of	
4-H (March of Dimes, Salvation Army, Cancer Fund, Community	
Foundation, etc.).
