STATE FAIR STATIC (INDOOR) PROJECT ENTRY

Each county fair's 4-H division allows qualification for the Kansas State Fair in accordance with the expectations outlined in the Kansas 4-H State Fair Book.

- Youth must be 9 years old by January 1 of the current year to be eligible for the State Fair.
- To qualify for the State Fair, static exhibits must have earned a purple ribbon at the county fair level. A purple ribbon does not include county fair grand or reserve grand or class champion awards/trophies/rosettes.
- There may be additional exhibit requirements from what you presented at the county-level in order to exhibit at the state fair, and some county-level projects are not eligible to go to state.
- Read the Kansas State Fair 4-H Fair Book for project classes and requirements. Projects WILL be disqualified if requirements are not met! Find the Kansas 4-H State Fair Book at www.kansas4-h.org/educationalexperiences/fair-resources/kansas-state-fair/.
- Post Rock District staff will complete the entry process as outlined by Kansas 4-H, using the information submitted by qualifying members. Your project will ONLY be entered in the state fair if you meet your county's deadline and commit to state fair entry. Call your Extension Office ASAP so you don't miss any deadlines!

PROJECT TRANSPORTATION TO STATE FAIR - DUE BY AUGUST 28

Post Rock District staff will coordinate transportation of non-animal exhibits to-and-from the Kansas State Fair for 4-H exhibition. Exhibits will ONLY be transported by extension staff if they can easily be moved by one person, if they can fit within an extension vehicle, and if they can be safely transported with many other items. 4-H members can transport their own items, including those that are too large, heavy or fragile.

- Exhibits (except fresh-baked foods, fresh-picked vegetables, and fresh-picked flowers) need to be dropped off at your Extension Office BEFORE August 28 at close of business. This will allow staff to confirm your project has all needed paperwork and exhibition permission forms with signatures before the holiday weekend.
- Freshly baked/picked foods, vegetables, and flowers that will be entered as exhibits can be brought to the office at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 3. Don't be late or your project may get left behind!
- Bring exhibits to the office ready to be safely transported in a vehicle with many other items. Old towels/blankets and boxes/totes that fit your project's size are very helpful. Make sure everything is marked with your name so you get them back after fair.

The Extension Office coordinates the transport of static projects to and from Hutchinson, but not animal projects. Those that qualify for State Fair will soon be receiving an email with more information and deadlines!

4-H PRESENTATIONS AT STATE FAIR

Remember that 4-H Members ages 9 and older who participated in 4-H Day and received a purple can take their project talks, demonstrations, and illustrated talks to the Kansas State Fair. Poetry entries can also be entered. New this year, Public Speaking entries can come to the State Fair; however, regardless of the purple-earning topic used locally, all contestants at the State Fair will use the same topic, "What 4-H Means to Me". STATE FAIR 4-H VOLUNTEER & LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

There are many opportunities to gain leadership experience as a volunteer at the Kansas State Fair. It is a great way to get leadership hours to contribute toward your project record book or earn an achievement pin. Volunteering is also a fantastic way to grow as a club leader, project leader, or even train to be a county fair judge in a project area of interest! If you want to volunteer or have some questions, contact your local Post Rock District Extension Office and we will assist you with signing up!

- GREETERS: Serve as a greeter at the 4-H Centennial Hall informational booth any day during the State Fair.
- JUDGING ASSISTANTS: Serve as a judging assistant on September 4 or 5 in a static project judging area of interest. Record notes for judges, assist with organizing projects, help enter exhibits, etc.
- FASHION REVUE EVENT ASSISTANTS: The Northwest KS Area is responsible for hosting the fashion revue at State Fair this year. We can use teen and adult volunteers. If you are able to help September 13 please let your local office know!

COOL CAREERS VIDEO PRODUCTION CONTEST ENTRIES DUE AUGUST 1

Last call for Cool Careers 4-H Video Contest entries - entry deadline is August 1! Cool Careers 4-H Video Contest is open to any 4-H member enrolled for the current 4-H year. 4-H members will select a profession within one of their projects in which they are enrolled for the current year. 4-H members will film, edit, and publish an original video (4-10 minutes in length) about a professional working in this field and their career. These videos should be geared towards youth 4th - 8th grade to inspire and introduce them to the exciting opportunities in the selected field of work. 4-H youth are encouraged to use equipment they have at home - cell phones, iPad or other tablet, home computer, camera, etc. More details are on the Kansas 4-H Cool Careers webpage.

KANSAS 4-H LIVESTOCK SWEEPSTAKES IS AUGUST 23-24

Kansas 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes will be hosted August 23-24 in Manhattan. The deadline to register is August 1 to the state, so all interested youth must notify their local Extension Office ASAP so we can enter Post Rock District teams. Youth from multiple Post Rock District counties can make up a team. The expenses and transportation for participation are up to each individual. Post Rock District staff do not coach teams, so adult volunteers are also needed to serve as coaches. The contest rules, schedule, and more information are posted on the <u>Livestock Sweepstakes</u> page of the youth livestock website. Call your local Extension Office if you have questions.

KANSAS 4-H HORTICULTURE JUDGING IS AUGUST 16

The State 4-H Horticulture Judging Contest will be held on Saturday, August 16 in Manhattan. The contest is hosted for the day by the K-State Department of Horticulture and Natural Resources. If you are interested in participating as an individual or on a Post Rock District team, contact your local Extension Office ASAP so that we can meet the state's August 8 deadline. An adult coach will also need to be identified for anyone participating. Costs and travel are the responsibility of each participant. The study list for the knowledge portion of the contest has been updated and is available with other contest details on the <u>Kansas 4-H State Horticulture Judging Contest webpage</u>.

KANSAS 4-H/FFA WHEAT EXPO IS AUGUST 7

The State Wheat Expo will take place on August 7 in Hutchinson. The wheat expo will be a fun, educational and hands-on program for all Kansas 4-H members, siblings, parents, and grandparents. You do not have to be enrolled in crops/plant science projects to participate. 4-H members enrolled in Foods and Nutrition, Photography and Field Crops are encouraged to participate. The Wheat Expo is a wheat fun day showcasing all things wheat. Lunch and refreshments are sponsored, and tours will be available. There will be eight contests open to youth members with cash prizes and ribbons awarded. Event details and registration are available on the Wheat Expo website.

KANSAS 4-H WHEAT VARIETY PLOT ENROLLMENT FOR 2026

The 2025-26 4-H Wheat Variety Plot program begins in the fall of 2025 with planting and wraps up in the fall of 2026 with the State 4-H Wheat Variety Plot displays at the Kansas State Fair. The 4-H Wheat Variety Plot program is open to all 4-H members enrolled in the 4-H Agronomy project who have an interest in studying how different wheat varieties perform in their part of the state. 4-H members are encouraged to work closely with their local agriculture agent and/or an adult mentor. The 4-H Wheat Varieties are meant to be a hands-on experience for youth and set in a similar way as local Extension Wheat Variety plots. There will be no cost for the program in 2025-26 since the five varieties are again being sponsored by commercial companies. Interested members should contact their local Extension Office ASAP so that Post Rock District can meet the state enrollment deadline of August 1.

KANSAS 4-H STATE YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE DELEGATE APPLICATIONS OPEN

The application and information about the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council and National 4-H Conference are available now! The Youth Council Application and National 4-H Conference Application will be combined this year, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2026, may apply as a Council Representative, and those 15-18 before January 1, 2026, may apply for the National 4-H Conference. This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives for one-year terms on the Council. Up to six National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview prior to KYLF, and they serve a two-year term on the council. The deadline to apply will be October 1, 2025. 

ACHIEVEMENT PINS AND RECORD BOOKS ARE DUE OCTOBER 1!



4-H Member Achievement Pins: Achievement pins are designed to recognize 4-H members as they reach milestones throughout their 4-H journey. The pins are awarded in a series. As a member's 4-H journey progresses, the achievement pin requirements expand to challenge individuals to explore and engage in more opportunities to develop life skills. Contact your local Extension Office if you are not sure what pin to apply for!



Permanent Record: Every 4-H member should complete the 4-H permanent record. This is an ongoing record of your involvement and it is required to be eligible for many awards. It can be a really helpful tool when applying for scholarships and a great summary of your 4-H and non-4-H journey!

Project Record: It is recommended that each 4-H member complete a Project Record Report for one (1) project you focused on during 2023-2024 4-H program year. You can complete more project records if you'd like, yet focusing on at least one gives you the opportunity to build important life skills related to records and reporting.

ZBooks: Zbooks is an online record keeping software. Record keeping and project reporting are valuable skills taught to members of the Kansas 4-H program. Using Zbooks, you'll be able to summarize project experiences on the Kansas 4-H Project Report Form and in your Permanent Record.





Personal Page: The personal page is a document that accompanies your record books each year. It is a quick reference for review committees as they consider your record books and other applications for recognition.

CLUB DECISIONS TO TRANSITION 4-H YEARS

As your 4-H Club wraps up the current program year and prepares for the 2025-26 year to begin in October, there are some important business decisions that need club motions. Please make sure these decisions are clearly articulated in meeting minutes in the coming months.

- Club Leaders (2 registered and screened adult volunteers needed)
- · Club Officers
- Club Financial Signatories (Signatories cannot be from the same immediate family. You need at least two registered and screened adult volunteers on the account. Youth signatories are also allowed.)
- Club Financial Review Committee (After your club receives your September financial statements, you can conduct your 2024-2025 financial review. More information will be in the next newsletter. You can decide now who will be on the review committee. The committee should be 3 adults OR 2 adults/2 youth, and no one can be immediate family to a signatory.)

FUNDRAISERS FOR 4-H CLUBS NEED TO NOTIFY THE EXTENSION OFFICE IN ADVANCE

Communicate with your local Extension Office in the early planning stages of your fundraiser to make sure you meet all Kansas 4-H policies and best practices relating to raising money in the name of 4-H. We have a form that helps share the necessary information. Complete the form and submit it to your local Extension Office or email to postrock4h@ksu.edu BEFORE beginning your fundraiser. Do not promote or implement your fundraiser until you receive approval from Post Rock District. Allow at least 10 business days for the fundraiser to be reviewed. If the fundraiser needs to be revised, the individual listed on the form is the one who will be contacted. 4-H BRANDING REQUIRED ON CLOTHING, AWARDS, AND SWAG



The use of the K-State Research and Extension/Kansas 4-H co-wordmark is required on all 4-H print, digital, apparel, and merchandise. This requirement applies to all designs created at the local, county, district, area, and state levels BEFORE ordering any items to ensure your club, council, fair board, etc. are using licensed vendors and that all designs include the required co-wordmark. We have a form to help with approval. Submit the form & design artwork (in full color) to your local Extension Office or by email to postrock4h@ksu.edu. Allow at least 10 business days for the design to be reviewed. If edits need to be made, the individual listed on the form is the one who will be contacted. Find the form at www.postrock.k-state.edu/4-h/club-and-council-support/branding-and-marketing/.
