In 2026, 4-H Quiz Bowl will be a fun, regional event! We are going to extend an invitation to neighboring extension unit 4-H members to participate along with our Post Rock District youth. **Make plans to participate in 4-H Quiz Bowl on Saturday, January 10 at Sylvan-Lucas Unified High School in Sylvan Grove.** The event will take place throughout the morning. The 4-H Quiz Bowl is a fun, semi-competitive event where participants demonstrate their knowledge about various topics related to the 4-H program, its history, and its values. It is designed to help youth deepen their understanding of 4-H while fostering teamwork, leadership, and public speaking skills!

It is free to participate, but registration is needed by January 5. Youth will participate in teams of four. There will be two age divisions, junior and senior. Team members must participate in the division of the oldest member. You do not have to be from the same club or county to be on a team together. When you register, tell us what team you intend to be on. ADULT VOLUNTEERS NEED TO ENROLL IN 4-H ONLINE BY DECEMBER 22

Anytime youth gather in the name of 4-H, it is important that there are two adults present who have been approved by Post Rock District as 4-H registered and screened volunteers! A 4-H Club is required to have two club leaders, yet it takes many more volunteers to have successful project learning experiences, workshops, community service activities, etc. Register as an adult volunteer in 4-H Online as soon as possible. After registering, your local Extension Office staff will share with you the steps to complete the required background check. This is paid for by Post Rock District. Once all of these steps are completed, you are eligible to be considered for approval by the Post Rock District Governing Board. Volunteers complete these steps during their initial enrollment. Each year after, volunteers can renew in 4-H Online without the extra steps. **If you plan to assist/support your club, council, or at project meetings (beyond helping the children in your immediate family), please register as an adult volunteer!**

SAVE THE DATE FOR BEEF WEIGH-IN



Smith County beef weigh-in is tentatively planned for Saturday morning, February 28, from 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. at the Smith Center Vet Clinic. 4-H Council will confirm the date and details at their next meeting.

All beef must be weighed-in to be part of the Smith County Fair 4-H rate-of-gain contest. While the contest is optional, it is **HIGHLY RECOMMENDED** for youth showing market beef because it provides a great livestock industry learning experience.

SMALL ANIMAL WEIGH-IN EID TAGGING VERIFICATION APRIL 26 AFTERNOON

Looking ahead... The county small animal weigh-in will be April 26. Right now, the rate-of-gain weigh-in for small animals is only sheep and goats. If you'd like to see swine added, talk about it at a club meeting and send feedback with a Council representative. This is the way the Council considers new/different ideas.

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SET 4-H PROJECT GOALS BEFORE JANUARY 1

CHECK YOUR EMAIL FOR 4-H COMMUNICATIONS

Post Rock District and Kansas 4-H use email as primary means of communication. We use the email contact information shared when you enroll in 4-H Online. Please check that your current email and phone are included in 4-H Online. Your local Extension Office can assist with updating this contact information or adding additional emails to your account contact list.

NEWS RELEASES AND SUCCESS STORIES

4-H club officers are encouraged to share the exciting activities your club is up to by emailing a photo and short success story to your local office or postrock4h@ksu.edu. While you are sharing your impact, remember to submit news releases about your 4-H club to the local newspaper!

- Club Leaders are encouraged to check with the Extension Office to see if any of your club members have selected to NOT have their name and picture used for any outreach and communication. If permission is not given by the family, the club must also respect these choices.

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YQCA IN-PERSON CLASS OPPORTUNITIES

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program that covers food safety, animal well-being, and character development. It is a great learning experience for youth involved in any livestock project! The class is required to be completed annually by all Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and Kansas Junior Livestock Show participants. YQCA training can be completed online or by attending an in-person class.

If so, your animals will need to be EID tagged and verified in-person by a Post Rock District employee. SHOOTING SPORTS PROJECT FEE DUE BY DECEMBER 11

If you enrolled in a Shooting Sports project, it is time to pay your County 4-H Council the \$10.00 project participation fee. One amount is due regardless of number of disciplines enrolled in. The project fee supports the special requirements needed to maintain a 4-H Shooting Sports Program in the Post Rock District. If you do not submit your fee by December 11, you will be removed from Shooting Sports project enrollment. You will not be able to re-enroll in the project disciplines until the fee is paid.

Youth 8 years old before January 1, 2026 can participate in 4-H Shooting Sports. Youth MUST be actively enrolled in Shooting Sports via 4-H Online to be able to attend any practice or activity. Contact Tonia Underwood, tiunderw@ksu.edu, our District's certified Shooting Sports Coordinator, to learn about practices with our certified instructors.

WINTER ARCHERY PRACTICES

Indoor archery practices will be on January 18, 25 and February 1, 15, and 22 at the Jewell County Fairgrounds in Mankato. KANSAS 4-H SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE IS JANUARY 5



The application for Kansas 4-H Scholarships are now available on the [Kansas 4-H website under Awards & Recognition](#). The Kansas 4-H Scholarship program is open to graduating high school seniors, current college students, and graduate students who have been part of the 4-H experience. Each scholarship has its own criteria, and you may qualify for several. You will only need to fill out one application to be considered for all available scholarships. It is important to review the requirements before getting started on your application. Applications and supporting documents are due no later than January 5, 2026 by 11:59 p.m. CST.

4-H PROJECT RECORDS ADVANCING TO REGIONAL JUDGING DUE JANUARY 6

Post Rock District Senior age 4-H members (ages 14 – 18) are eligible to advance to the Northwest 4-H Project Record screening if they were chosen as the project award winner in their local county. 4-H members must turn in project records for regional screening to their local Post Rock District Extension Office by January 6, 2026. This allows us to get the project records to our Post Rock District staff who will be going to the Northwest Regional Screening on January 13. The following items complete a Regional Project Award submission: check sheet; personal information page; cover letter; resume; and project report form. The mission of the Insect Zoo is to foster a better understanding and increased awareness of our microcosmic, natural world and of the important roles that insects and their relatives play in it. The Zoo offers an interactive experience for visitors, where they can experience the sights, sounds, and smells of live creepy crawlies, including giant cockroaches, beetles, giant walking and prickly sticks... praying mantises, and centipedes... scorpions, and tarantulas. FUNDRAISERS FOR 4-H CLUBS

NEED TO NOTIFY THE EXTENSION OFFICE IN ADVANCE

Communicate with your local Extension Office in the early planning stages of your fundraiser to make sure you meet all Kansas 4-H policies and best practices relating to raising money in the name of 4-H. We have a form that helps share the necessary information. Complete the form and submit it to your local Extension Office or email to postrock4h@ksu.edu BEFORE beginning your fundraiser. Do not promote or implement your fundraiser until you receive approval from Post Rock District. Allow at least 10 business days for the fundraiser to be reviewed. If the fundraiser needs to be revised, the individual listed on the form is the one who will be contacted. 4-H BRANDING REQUIRED ON CLOTHING, AWARDS, AND SWAG

The use of the K-State Research and Extension/Kansas 4-H co-wordmark is required on all 4-H print, digital, apparel, and merchandise. This requirement applies to all designs created at the local, county, district, area, and state levels BEFORE ordering any items to ensure your club, council, fair board, etc. are using licensed vendors and that all designs include the required co-wordmark. We have a form to help with approval. Submit the form & design artwork (in full color) to your local Extension Office or by email to postrock4h@ksu.edu. Allow at least 10 business days for the design to be reviewed. If edits need to be made, the individual listed on the form is the one who will be contacted.
