ENROLLING FOR THE NEW 4-H YEAR

4-H Online will open on **October 1st** to enroll in the new 4-H year! A few reminders:

- Each 4-Her and adult volunteer (club leaders, adults that help with events that will require background checks) needs to be enrolled in 4-H online each year. Adult volunteers have a separate enrollment from their children.
- **PLEASE USE AN EMAIL YOU HAVE ACCESS TO AND CHECK REGULARLY WHEN ENROLLING.** Email is the primary means of communication not only in our county, but district and statewide as well. We compile a list of emails for communications at the end of October, so please enroll sooner rather than later so that you don't miss out on any important news!

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ACHIEVEMENT PINS AND RECORD BOOKS ARE DUE OCTOBER 1!



4-H Member Achievement Pins: Achievement pins are designed to recognize 4-H members as they reach milestones throughout their 4-H journey. The pins are awarded in a series. As a member's 4-H journey progresses, the achievement pin requirements expand to challenge individuals to explore and engage in more opportunities to develop life skills. Contact your local Extension Office if you are not sure what pin to apply for!

Permanent Record: Every 4-H member should complete the 4-H permanent record. This is an ongoing record of your involvement and it is required to be eligible for many awards. It can be a really helpful tool when applying for scholarships and a great summary of your 4-H and non-4-H journey!

Project Record: It is recommended that each 4-H member complete a Project Record Report for one (1) project you focused on during 2024-2025 4-H program year. You can complete more project records if you'd like, yet focusing on at least one gives you the opportunity to build important life skills related to records and reporting.

ZBooks: Zbooks is an online record keeping software. Record keeping and project reporting are valuable skills taught to members of the Kansas 4-H program. Using Zbooks, you'll be able to summarize project experiences on the Kansas 4-H Project Report Form and in your Permanent Record.

4-H ENROLLMENT FOR THE 2025-2026 YEAR BEGINS OCTOBER 1!

Enrollment for the 2025-2026 year will begin October 1. Current and new members must enroll each year through 4-H Online.

- If you know of a family wanting to join a local community club, please share their email and phone number with your local Extension Office. We don't want them to miss out on important enrollment details.
- Invite families to your 4-H club activities now so they are ready to enroll this fall!
- Do NOT try to enroll for the new program year in September as 4-H Online will not accept any enrollments until October 1.

for officers, committee members, and 4-Hers wanting to learn to be a leader in your club

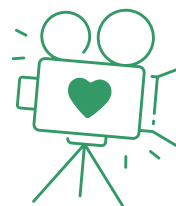

The current presidential administration is launching a year-long challenge for K-12 students across the country to spark interest in Artificial Intelligence (AI), promote creative thinking using AI tools, and demonstrate how AI technology can be used in beneficial ways. Early training and experience in responsible AI use can demystify the technology and support America's youth in cultivating skills and knowledge necessary to thrive in an AI-driven workforce. STATE YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL / NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE DELEGATE *APPLICATIONS DUE OCTOBER 1*

The application and information about the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council and National 4-H Conference are available now! The Youth Council Application and National 4-H Conference Application will be combined this year, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2026, may apply as a Council Representative, and those 15-18 before January 1, 2026, may apply for the National 4-H Conference. This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives for one-year terms on the Council. Up to six National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview prior to KYLF, and they serve a two-year term on the council. The deadline to apply will be October 1, 2025. SHOOTING SPORTS VOLUNTEER TRAINING

Kansas 4-H Shooting Sports will be having a Shooting Sports Instructor Training on October 25-26 at Cimarron. You must be a trained instructor to lead Shooting Sports project meetings in Post Rock District. We have a need for more discipline instructors across the District, so consider becoming trained if you have a passion for positive youth development through shooting sports. New instructors must be screened and registered as a 4-H volunteer, which includes enrolling in 4-H Online, completing a background check, completing an orientation, and being approved by the Post Rock District. Before attending the in-person Instructor Training, you must also complete the National 4-H Shooting Sports online modules. You can be trained in one discipline at the training. While there is a personal cost to become trained, we can help you seek out financial support. You must be certified to be able to instruct youth in the 4-H Shooting Sports Program. FUNDRAISERS FOR 4-H CLUBS

NEED TO NOTIFY THE EXTENSION OFFICE IN ADVANCE

Communicate with your local Extension Office in the early planning stages of your fundraiser to make sure you meet all Kansas 4-H policies and best practices relating to raising money in the name of 4-H. We have a form that helps share the necessary information. Complete the form and submit it to your local Extension Office or email to postrock4h@ksu.edu BEFORE beginning your fundraiser. Do not promote or implement your fundraiser until you receive approval from Post Rock District. Allow at least 10 business days for the fundraiser to be reviewed. If the fundraiser needs to be revised, the individual listed on the form is the one who will be contacted. 4-H BRANDING REQUIRED ON CLOTHING, AWARDS, AND SWAG

The use of the K-State Research and Extension/Kansas 4-H co-wordmark is required on all 4-H print, digital, apparel, and merchandise. This requirement applies to all designs created at the local, county, district, area, and state levels BEFORE ordering any items to ensure your club, council, fair board, etc. are using licensed vendors and that all designs include the required co-wordmark. We have a form to help with approval. Submit the form & design artwork (in full color) to your local Extension Office or by email to postrock4h@ksu.edu. Allow at least 10 business days for the design to be reviewed. If edits need to be made, the individual listed on the form is the one who will be contacted. 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CLUB DECISIONS TO TRANSITION 4-H YEARS

As your 4-H Club wraps up the current program year and prepares for the 2025-26 year to begin in October, there are some important business decisions that need club motions. **Please make sure these decisions are clearly articulated in meeting minutes in the coming months. It is important to submit a copy of these minutes to the Extension Office!**

- Club Leaders (2 registered and screened adult volunteers needed)
- Club Officers
- Club Financial Signatories (Signatories cannot be from the same immediate family. You need at least two registered and screened adult volunteers on the account. Youth signatories are also allowed.)
- Club Financial Review Committee (After your club receives your September financial statements, you can conduct your 2024-2025 financial review. You can decide now who will be on the review committee. The committee should be 3 adults OR 2 adults/2 youth, and no one can be immediate family to a signatory.)

ANNUAL FINANCIAL REVIEW

It is time to complete your 4-H Club's annual financial review. Completed reviews are due to your local Extension Office no later than close of business on November 3, 2025. We will be sending an email to Club Leaders in early September with specific details about this review. If you have any questions about the required review, please reach out to Nora Rhoades at nhoades@ksu.edu or contact your local Extension Office.

Due to your local Extension Office by November 3 (because the first is a weekend):

- Submit the Annual Financial Report as completed by the Financial Review Committee.
- Submit the entire October 2024 and September 2025 bank statements for every account (checking, savings, etc.). If a check image is not included on these statements, also submit at least one statement/per account with a check image.
- Submit a copy of club meeting minutes that state who your club leaders are, officer elections, and signatories are for the year under review AND for the year we'll kickoff soon.
- Confirm a copy of the 4-H Club's current EIN and tax exemption form is on file at the local Extension Office.
