3. Assign all members a part in monthly club meeting
4. Have a backwards club meeting
5. Hold a parents night
6. Hold goal planning and project planning meetings
7. Invite district agents to a club meeting
8. Have members and parents attend monthly meetings/activities
9. Provide project leaders for projects with 3 or more enrolled members
10. Have club parties for special occasions/holidays
11. Donate to thrift shop, county food pantry, community projects
12. Make monetary contribution to county Junior Leader group
13. Go caroling
14. Make donation for using copier, buildings, etc
15. Club be represented at Achievement Program
16. Hold meetings and events on time

29. Have at least four parliamentary talks
30. Help with county Achievement Program and/or coronation of 4-H King and Queen
31. Have members active in county junior leader organization
32. Members take part in junior leader trip
33. Have parents participate at parent's night meeting
34. Conduct ceremonies (i.e. installation, club seal)
35. Collect for established funds (i.e. arthritis, American Heart, 4-H Foundation)
36. Exhibit cookie jar at county fair
37. Make radio announcements

Blue Seal Goals

40. Involve *all parents* as leaders (club or project) or as club committee members
41. Majority of members give at least one program presentation at a club meeting
42. Have a club training (i.e. modeling, rocket shoot, fashion show)
43. Hold project meetings
44. Teach and practice parliamentary procedures at *every monthly meeting*
45. Work on community service project
46. Participate in club and/or county judging training / contests
47. Help with county fair clean up, food stand, grounds keeping
48. Members actively serve as county fair youth superintendents
49. Have one member present at each regular county junior leader meeting
50. Members compete in any county contest (i.e. fashion revue, judging, showmanship)
51. Have 50% of members participation in district 4-H Day
52. Have at least 70% members present at County Achievement Program
53. Make special occasion cards, gifts, treats for senior citizens
54. Give food basket / thank you gift to community residents / businesses
55. Provide program / presentation at senior center or living facility
56. Have an educational club tour
57. Decorate Christmas tree at Community Center or local contest
